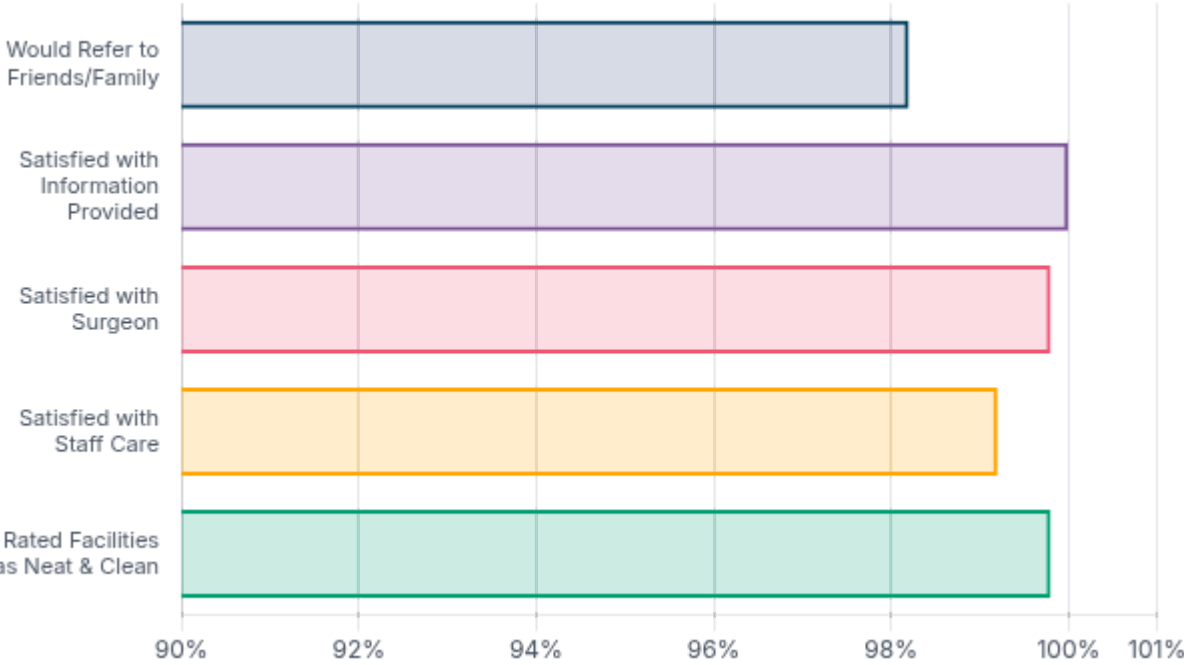

Mandatory Insurance Checklist (Type V Visa)

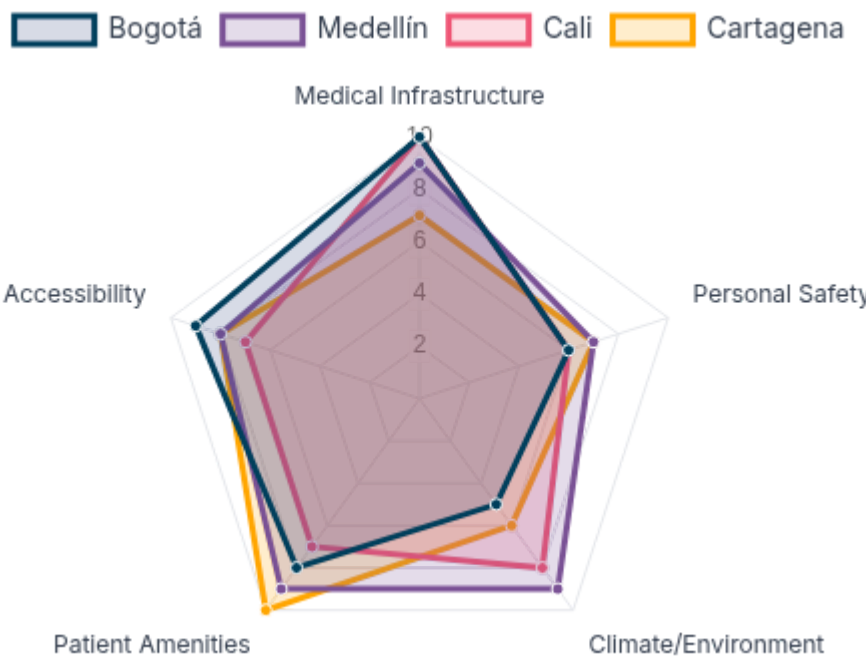
The Colombian government requires a policy covering these specific areas. Use this list to vet your specialized medical travel insurance.

- ✓ Emergency Medical Evacuation (high limit).
- ✓ Repatriation of Remains (legally required).
- ✓ Covers pre-existing conditions.
- ✓ Direct payment agreements with hospitals.

This radar chart provides a comparative snapshot of the four main cities. Bogotá and Cali lead in top-tier medical infrastructure, while Medellín offers a balanced profile with a modern feel. Cartagena is ideal for wellness and recovery but has a higher risk of petty crime. All cities require vigilance, but the nature of the primary risk varies significantly.

Phase 2: Final Prep

- Book accommodation in a recommended safe zone.
- Arrange all transport through vetted providers.
- Get required vaccinations (e.g., Yellow Fever).
- Apply for Type V Medical Visa & complete Check-Mig.

Phase 3: On The Ground

- Live by the "No Dar Papaya" protocol.
- Save emergency numbers (123) and embassy contacts.
- Keep your insurance hotline details accessible.
